



2022 Virtual Training Series for Prosecutors

In September 2022, the [National Clearinghouse on Abuse in Later Life \(NCALL\)](#), under a grant from the U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women, offered a weekly series of four virtual training opportunities for prosecutors.

Elder abuse is a pervasive yet vastly underreported problem. With 10,000 Americans turning 65 every day, the population is aging, and the incidence of elder abuse can be expected to rise as well. The purpose of this series is to provide prosecutors with timely, practical information so they are better equipped to make well-informed prosecutorial decisions in cases involving older victims.

The series, taught by nationally recognized experts in the field, addressed issues where there has been a high demand for training: Financial Exploitation, Confidentiality, Dementia and Capacity, and Medical Evidence.
