

Practice Update: New Fee Waiver Form in Effect December 2, 2019

Effective Monday, December 2nd, USCIS will reject any Form I-912 with an edition date of 03/13/18 or earlier, or any fee waiver request submitted *without Form I-912* that is postmarked on or after Dec. 2, 2019. USCIS will adjudicate any fee waiver request postmarked *before* Dec. 2, 2019 <u>under the previous policy.</u>

On and after December 2nd, USCIS will only consider fee waivers on a Form I-912 with the edition date 10/24/2019, and will be using the new limited criteria of 1) income at or under 150% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or 2) financial hardship that prevents applicants from paying the filing fee, including unexpected medical bills or emergencies.

IMPORTANT NOTE: The <u>new proposed fee rule</u> contains additional limitations on fee waiver criteria. This fee rule is currently under notice and comment with a deadline for comment on December 16, 2019. Note these additional changes **have NOT gone into effect yet.**
