#### LEGAL ASSISTANCE DEFINED

assistance provided by or under the direct supervision of a person described in subparagraph (B) to an adult, youth, or child victim of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking relating to a matter described in subparagraph (C).

# (B) PERSON DESCRIBED



- a licensed attorney
- in immigration proceedings, a Board of Immigration Appeals accredited representative
- in claims of the Department of Veterans
   Affairs, a representative authorized by the
   Secretary of Veterans Affairs
- any person who functions as an attorney or lay advocate in Tribal court

## (C) MATTER DESCRIBED

- (i) divorce, parental rights, child support, Tribal, territorial, immigration, employment, administrative agency, housing, campus, education, healthcare, privacy, contract, consumer, civil rights, protection or other injunctive proceedings, related enforcement proceedings, and other similar matters;
- (ii) criminal justice investigations, prosecutions, and post-conviction matters (including sentencing, parole, and probation) that impact the victim's safety, privacy, or other interests as a victim;
- (iii) alternative dispute resolution, restorative practices, or other processes intended to promote victim safety, privacy, and autonomy, and offender accountability, regardless of court involvement; or
- (iv) with respect to a conviction of a victim relating to or arising from victimization of the victim, post-conviction relief proceedings in State, local, Tribal, or territorial court.

(D) INTAKE OR REFERRAL

Does not constitute legal assistance

### (I)(A)-WHO PROVIDES THE LEGAL ASSISTANCE



- a licensed attorney
- working under the direct supervision of a licensed attorney
- in immigration proceedings, a Board of Immigration Appeals accredited representative
- in Veterans' Administration claims, an accredited representative
- any person who functions as an attorney or lay advocate in Tribal court

## (I)(B) WHAT **EXPERTISE OR TRAINING DOES THE** PERSON **PROVIDING** THE LEGAL **ASSISTANCE NEED TO** HAVE?

- demonstrated expertise in providing legal assistance to victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking in the targeted population; or
- partnered with an entity or person that has demonstrated expertise described above
   and
  - has completed, or will complete, training in connection with domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, or sexual assault and related legal issues, including training on evidence-based risk factors for domestic and dating violence homicide

#### WHO NEEDS TO BE INVOLVED IN THE TRAINING?

• (2) Any training program conducted in satisfaction of the requirement of paragraph (1) must be developed with input from and in collaboration with a tribal, state, territorial, local, or culturally specific domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking victim service provider or coalition, as well as appropriate tribal, state, territorial, and local law enforcement officials

WHO NEEDS TO BE INFORMED ABOUT THE LEGAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THE GRANT?

• (3) Any person or organization providing legal assistance through an OVW grant must inform state, local, or tribal domestic violence, dating violence, or sexual assault programs and coalitions, as well as appropriate state and local law enforcement officials of their work.



(4) THE APPLICANT'S ORGANIZATIONAL **POLICIES DO NOT REQUIRE** MEDIATION OR COUNSELING INVOLVING OFFENDERS AND VICTIMS PHYSICALLY TOGETHER, IN CASES WHERE SEXUAL ASSAULT, DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE, STALKING, OR CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE IS AN ISSUE.
