




TRIBAL SERVICES VS. NON-TRIBAL SERVICES


- Anonymity/confidentiality
- Lack of Native Education (other clients and agency)
- Fear of location


BARRIERS

- Location/1-2 hours to reach services
- Fear of losing children
- Housing on and off the reservation
- Cultural shock (rural vs. urban)

TRIBAL CLIENT ENGAGEMENT

- Do not ask inquisitive questions
- Do not disclose your Native ancestry
- It is okay to ask about the tribal resources or services
- Okay to ask about traditions or practices





BEING GOOD RELATIVES

- Partnerships
- Land Acknowledgements
- Resource sharing and education

KNOW THE TRIBAL RESOURCES

- Tribal Court
- Shelter
- Transitional Housing
- Advocacy
- Victim Compensation

BE CONSCIOUS OF CULTURAL PRACTICES

- Smudging (burning of sage)
- Time away for ceremony (all night)
- Fasting/Cleansing

SERVICE PROVIDERS

- Practices and Policies
- Microaggressions
- Consistency/long-term goals

PARTNERSHIPS

- Asking for training
- Inviting to join events & present
- Find ways to support the tribe or tribal program
- Resource sharing/joint events

PARTNERSHIPS

- Hiring Tribal people (tokenism)
- Involving Tribal people in planning





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
